### FULL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

20:10 start

1826. Chairman announcements

- Apologies – *Michael Lusadar*.
- Declaration of members interests

1827. Open Forum –

- a) Crow Lane – Contractor that work for CBC are doing the works as a ‘community day’ free of charge. This has been organised by Peter and the residents, this was not in anyway a job done by John Baker he was asked for help and passed it off due to being an unadopted road. Could we look into the road becoming adopted once it is in a good state? (Gary Powell).
- b) welcome to Steph Forester, come along to gain a connection to the community and find out a bit more about it, see how the meetings run and what is discussed as interested in the PC if a seat ever came available. Cllr Hopper - we currently have no vacancies but please come along to as many meetings as you can to have an input.
- c) 2026 – village events, lets think if there would be some events we could put on for the village? Treasure hunt. Events at the church as well as the Link Room.

1829. Finance:

- a) Orders for the payment of money. A schedule of payments will be distributed at the meeting for approval and authorisation.

1830. To consider Matters arising

- a) HGV watch Peter and Simon James (Woburn) agreed to have 2 sessions next week between 8am-10am in Woburn where they will record any HGV’s passing. Woburn is the centre of the no ban zone. Any lorry passing through Woburn is effectively passing through or not following the rules. The idea is the info that is gathered will go to the chief constable and commissioner with the backing of the duke. He has agreed to provide 10 volunteers (staff) to get involved. Gathering the data as a trail and see if anything is done with this from the Police. 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> – meet at the Black Horse Woburn if you would like to get involved. Cllr Hopper – questioned if we have average speed cameras through the village do you think it would reduce HGV numbers? Cllr George – yes, because most HGVs are cutting through for a short cut and speeding. The Duke has concerns that the constant vibration of the HGVs is causing major problems for the old buildings.
- b) Traffic calming – engage with CBC, what if any are the options.

- c) Greensands ridge support – Tom has done this on our behalf as agreed over email earlier in the week.
